Solid Waste:

Commercial Waste Hauled totaled 279 T.; Residential Waste Hauled totaled 184 T. Medical Waste totaled 1.99 T. Thirty eight extra pick-ups were completed. One 96 gal toter, zero 64 gal toters and 2 yard waste toters were delivered. Four toters and four dumpsters were repaired.

Recycling:

A total of 65 bales of various materials were made. Zero bales were shipped. A total of 4.8 tons of glass was processed. Land fill savings totaled \$737.61.

Water:

Water pumped for municipal use totaled 38,847,956 gallons. Water treatment plant production totaled 30,981,227 gallons. There were 35 meter re-reads. Turn on/off's and occupant changes totaled 0, took Bac-T's Arsenic samples for the State. Finished water inventory and sent the results in to WSB to be checked for accuracy. Read meters.

Water Treatment Facility:

Water produced = 30,981,227 gal. Average CL2 = 1.62 mg/l Average Raw Arsenic = 42.9 ppb Average Finished Arsenic = 8.0 ppb (MCL=10ppb) Coagulant used (Ferric Chloride) = 830 gal. Sodium Hypochlorite Used (Chloride) = 730 gal. Average Recovery Ratio =91.5%.

Wastewater:

Biochemical Oxygen Demand Monthly Average: 98%. Total discharge for the month was 29.46 million gallons. Total Suspended Solids Monthly Average: 98%. E.coli Monthly Average Effluent 1.0/100 mg. Ammonium Nitrogen (NH₄) Monthly Average: 4.80 mg/l. The department ran all routine monthly testing. Year to date locates complete.

Sewer:

Two sanitary sewers were inspected; seven were unplugged, seventeen were checked at customer's requests, twelve were cleaned and flushed. All lift stations were checked daily, worked on getting generators running. Was called out (1) after work hours for sewer related issue. Fixed floats on WalMart lift station. Worked on callout for lift stations.

East Alamosa:

Water supplied to East Alamosa totaled 2,300,508 gallons.
There were 41 meter re-reads and 9 frozen meters, with 19 calls and replaced 6 meters.
Took Bac-T Arsenic Samples for the State. Twenty three loads filled up water from hydrant.
Did non-payment, checked problem sewers every Friday and worked on generators.

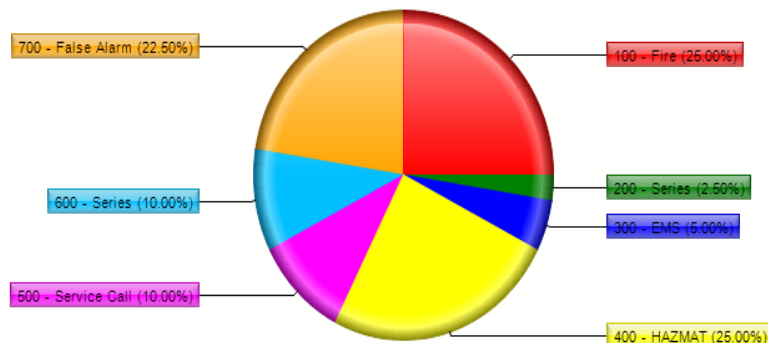
Alamosa Fire Department Monthly Report March 2022

Below is a statement regarding major issues covered by the City IT Department:

March 2022 Report

- Adlumin has reported to IT that multiple access errors have occurred directed from our firewall. After some investigation it was found that old credentials were cached on the firewall and were attempting to access the City's LDAP server. This system was set up when the City was utilizing Sonicwall's Global VPN Client instead of NetMotion. The error has since been resolved.
- In the understanding that IT infrastructure security is paramount during such times of political turmoil, IT has been coordinating with every resource to maintain a rigid security compliance structure. With quarterly reports from HR on personnel changes, IT has been running quarterly audits of AD credentials, lock access, and data retention.
- IT has attended multiple security trainings and webinars concerning the ongoing situation in Ukraine and Russia. It is well known that Russia as a state agency utilizes multiple attack vectors including cyber warfare. Per direction of the federal government and many private security analysts, cyber security training is more important than ever.

- Configured and deployed an additional camera for the Library's Local History room. The additional camera was added to our current surveillance system with no additional licensing cost.
- IT plans a 5 year replacement of each computer on the City network. At almost the exact 5 year mark, a computer in the Rec Center experienced a major hardware failure. Luckily the replacement computer was already provisioned and waiting in IT to be deployed. The replacement computer was deployed the same day the failure was reported.
- Working with Adlumin IT implemented ATIP Shield on both City network firewalls. ATIP allows for real-time search of individual IP addresses across multiple threat data sources. Additionally, incoming device data from firewalls, VPN servers, and network security appliances is scanned using the world's largest crowd-sourced threat intelligence platform, with more than 100,000 members across 140 countries. IT will receive notifications in the form of a detection if any incoming event contains an IP address that has been deemed potentially malicious.
- IT worked with Google to rebuild Google's Cloud Directory Sync after an upgrade. The rebuild cleared multiple errors and restored some functionality previously unused. This software coordinates the match between active directory accounts and Google accounts.
- Updated Google's password sync software.
- HR has begun providing IT quarterly reports of employee terminations. This helps IT complete audits on electronic and physical access. One of these audits was conducted in March.
- Updated licensing for Veeam, the software the City uses to create backups of data and virtual machines.
- IT investigated a power issue after receiving a report that the cameras at the homeless camp were unavailable. IT worked with the Parks department to identify a flipped breaker switch. Moving forward, IT now has access to the breaker box which will allow IT to respond quickly if power goes out again.
- Created a webpage for the PIO to post updates regarding the City of Alamosa's concerns with DA Alonzo Payne. This webpage will be updated regularly with new pertinent information.

- Created a webpage for information regarding the City's mass rezoning project.
- Investigated issues with cameras at the police training center. A switch reboot resolved the connectivity issues.
- Created specifically cut videos of city council meetings that encompass discussion of the DA.
- Met with Public Works and the City Attorney to discuss fiber conduit and the "Dig Once" Policy implemented by the City.
- Attended the Charter Franchise Agreement Renewal meetings.
- Performed a training with Development Services to cover the council chamber technology for future meetings.
- Worked with Rocky Mountain Fire and Alarm to replace 8 cameras in the Ice Rink/MUP office. The new cameras attach to the widely used City standard surveillance system.
- Worked with 1911 and Sophos to gather further information regarding their Mobile Device Management solution.
- Received over 1000 phones from Larimer County in a completely free giveaway. Larimer County is changing phone systems and the phones being abandoned match usability standards for both the City of Alamosa and City of Monte Vista
- Patched all City owned computers to the latest patch and vulnerability fixes from Microsoft. This monthly patching helps protect our computers from malicious software, resolve general windows issues/bugs, and provide access to new windows features.

In Monte Vista, we performed the following items:

- Deployed multiple computers per the City's 5 year replacement plan.
- Created a departmental drive for Ski Hi to securely store network files.
- Worked with Western NRG to evaluate SSL based Deep Packet Inspection as part of a bolstering of the City's security protocols.
- Updated NetMotion Mobility keys to continue using NetMotion as a source for the City's VPN service.
- Worked with the Police Department to set up wiring for a new office space.
- Received over 1000 phones from Larimer County in a completely free giveaway. Larimer County is changing phone systems and the phones being abandoned match usability standards for both the City of Alamosa and City of Monte Vista
- Working with Adlumin IT implemented ATIP Shield on both City network firewalls. ATIP allows for real-time search of individual IP addresses across multiple threat data sources.
