I. CALL TO ORDER AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

At 7:00 PM, the meeting was called to order by the City Clerk, and the Pledge of Allegiance was read.

At 7:05 PM, the City Clerk called roll call. Councilors Girego, Vigil, and Brooks were present. Councilor Chavez was absent.

Heather Brooks informed Council that the Executive Session scheduled for the end of the meeting is no longer necessary and requested it be removed from the agenda.

Councilor Girego moved and seconded by Councilor Vigil to approve the agenda as amended. The motion carried unanimously.

VII. REGULAR BUSINESS

E. Business Brought Forward by City Staff

1. Public Works

- a. First Reading, Ordinance No.14-2015, An ordinance renaming Cottonwood Drive and Cottonwood Court as depicted in the Replat of Carroll Subdivision – Addition No. 2, as filed in the records of the Alamosa County Clerk and Recorder on November 16, 1982 under Reception No. 220402.

Pat Steenburg presented information to Council. Cottonwood Drive and Cottonwood Court are both streets that lie within the Carroll Special Improvement District. With the streets named as is, this is problematic because there is already streets by the golf course with these names. The Planning Commission has examined this issue and in light of the fact that Cottonwood Drive is essentially an extension of Douglas, they have recommended that it be renamed Douglas Drive and Courtwood Court renamed Douglas Court.

Council Gillaspie moved, seconded by Councilor Vigil to approve Ordinance No. 14-2015, on first reading and set it for public hearing thereon on Wednesday, October 7, 2015 at 7:00 p.m. or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard. The motion carried unanimously.

- b. Permitted Use by Special Review – Request of the Alamosa Elks Lodge No. 1297 to allow outdoor dining in a commercial business district.

Pat Steenburg presented information to Council. The Alamosa Elks Lodge No. 1297 is requesting a Permitted Use by Special Review to allow outdoor dining in a commercial business district. This location allows dining where there would be no foreseeable impact to pedestrian activity, and while visible, visibility from the street is limited. This application has already been approved by Council acting as the local liquor licensing authority, and should serve to increase vitality and pedestrian activity in the downtown area.

It was moved by Councilor Vigil and seconded by Councilor Griego, to approve the Permitted Use by Special Review - Request of the Alamosa Elks Lodge No. 1297 to allow outdoor dining in a commercial business district. The motion carried unanimously.

- c. Final Plat, Replat of Lot 112, McClain-Fink Subdivision

Pat Steenburg presented information to Council. This subdivision creates two lots from the original lot being replatted. This request is a common action in that area of town as the lots were very large when this subdivision was originally platted in the county in 1938. This replat will better represent current development trends.

It was moved by Councilor Griego, and seconded by Councilor Stefano,

to adopt Resolution No. 10, 2015. The motion carried unanimously.

2. City Manager/Legal

a. City Manager Employment Agreement

Councilor Griego stated that he would like to review the comments regarding the City Manager's evaluation before it becomes a permanent record and requested this as an executive session.

Councilor Coleman commended the City Manager on the work she has done and is doing and thanked her for all that she has done.

Council agreed to set an executive session regarding the evaluation for a future date.

It was moved by Councilor Gillaspie, and seconded by Councilor Coleman, to approve the City Manager's employment agreement. The motion carried unanimously.

b. First Reading, Ordinance No. 15-2015, Clark Street Assessment Roll and Assessment Ordinance

Erich Schwiesow presented information to Council. This is closing out the Clark Street SID. The Clark Street Assessment Roll and Assessment Ordinance apportions the direct cost of each element of sidewalk to the parcel abutting the sidewalk, as shown on the schedule. Owners may either pay the entire sum and avoid interest, or may pay with installments over 5 years at 6% interest compounded annually. If they choose to pay the entire sum, they must do so within 30 days of the date of final publication of the ordinance, pursuant to C.R.S. § 31-25-31-25-524.

Councilor Griego moved, seconded by Councilor Stefano, to approve Ordinance No. 15-2015, on first reading and set it for public hearing thereon on Wednesday, October 7, 2015 at 7:00 p.m. or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard. The motion carried unanimously.

c. First Reading, Ordinance No. 17-2015, SID 14-1 (Carroll Subdivision No. 2) Assessment Ordinance

Erich Schwiesow presented information to Council. At the November 4, 2014 election, the eligible electors approved the issuance of special assessments imposed against benefited properties located within the District. The Project has been completed on time and under budget at considerable savings over the originally estimated costs. The assessment ordinance and assessment roll apportions those costs

amongst the lots on the basis of square footage of each lot benefited.

Councilor further discussed this ordinance.

Councilor Gillaspie moved, seconded by Councilor Griego, approve Ordinance No. 17-2015 and ask that staff make the change to the assessment roll that backs out charges for the design cost for water and sewer on those properties that already have that, on first reading and set it for public hearing thereon on Wednesday, October 7, 2015 at 7:00 p.m. or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard. The motion carried unanimously.

- d. Resolution 11-2015, Intent to Create Special Improvement District and Preliminary Order for gas, electric, and streetlighting in undeveloped portions of Carroll Subdivision No. 2.

Erich Schwiesow presented information to Council. The Resolution sets forth the City's intent to construct improvements by use of a special improvement district pursuant to Alamosa Charter XV, Section 3 and C.R.S. §31-25-501 et. seq. for portions of the Carroll Subdivision Addition No. 2 and preliminary order adopting preliminary plans and specifications for such improvements.

Councilor Griego moved, seconded by Councilor Stefano, to adopt Resolution 11-2015. The motion carried unanimously.

- e. First Reading, Ordinance No. 16-2015 Creating SID 2015-1 (Carroll Subdivision No. 2 gas and electric)

Erich Schwiesow presented information to Council. This is step number two in the same new SID as Resolution 11-2015. This Ordinance creates Special Improvement District No. 15-1 in portions of the Carroll Subdivision Addition No. 2 for gas, electric, and streetlight improvements.

Councilor Vigil moved, seconded by Councilor Gillaspie to approve Ordinance No. 16-2015, on first reading and set it for public hearing thereon on Wednesday, October 7, 2015 at 7:00 p.m. or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard. The motion carried unanimously.

- f. First Reading, Ordinance No. 18-2015, An Ordinance Authorizing Construction of Gas, Electric and Streetlighting Public Improvements within the City of Alamosa Special Improvement District 15-1 (Carroll Subdivision Addition No. 2) and Approving Issuance of a Preliminary Order for the Construction of Such Improvements in Special Improvement District 15-1

Erich Schwiesow presented information to Council. This ordinance authorizes the construction of the gas, electric, and streetlighting as set

forth in the preliminary order. This particular ordinance and after public hearing, orders the improvements.

Councilor Vigil moved, seconded by Councilor Gillaspie to approve Ordinance No. 18-2015, on first reading and set it for public hearing thereon on Wednesday, October 7, 2015 at 7:00 p.m. or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard. The motion carried unanimously.

F. Committee Reports

Councilor Griego reported on the marketing board.

G. Staff Announcements

Heather Brooks gave an update to the status of the City employees who were injured last week.

Heinz Bergann reminded Council of the upcoming events:

Pat Steenburg gave an update on 8th Street. Councilor Vigil asked for an update on the situation with Jerry Archuleta and Heather Brooks gave an update regarding that situation.

VIII. LOCAL LIQUOR LICENSING AUTHORITY ACTIONS

- A. Needs and Desires Hearing on the application of Ike & Ike, Inc. d/b/a El Charro Cafe for a Hotel/Restaurant License at 1605 Main Street

Counselor Schwiesow gave an overview of the hearing procedure, and the licensee's obligation to affirmatively prove the needs of the neighborhood and the desires of the adult inhabitants of the neighborhood. The City's presumptive neighborhood is the city limits plus a one-mile radius. No request has been made to consider different boundaries, so this neighborhood will apply to this hearing. There was a criminal background check that was done and turned up some records, which the applicants may wish to speak to if Council thinks it's even a consideration.

Mayor Lucero opened the hearing at 8:40 p.m. Counselor Schwiesow asked the applicants to identify themselves and provide evidence they have about the license they are seeking meeting the needs and desires of the neighborhood.

Ike Lucero and Ike Lucero, Jr. introduced themselves as the applicants.

Ike Lucero, Jr. resides in Pueblo, Colorado and Ike Lucero, Sr. resides in Alamosa, Colorado. Ike Lucero, Jr and Ike Lucero, Sr. are business partners of the El Charro Cafe.

The El Charro Cafe has been in business in their family and their desire is to serve margaritas and bottled beer. They will be located at 1605 Main Street in Alamosa, Colorado. In the past and in the present, their customers have asked them to provide this service.

Ike Lucero presented petitions to Mr. Schwiesow. There are about 60 signatures that are in favor and none that are not in favor. The petitions were obtained at the current restaurant location on 6th Street but the petitions do indicate the new location's address. Counselor Schwiesow accepted the petitions as Exhibit A. The public hearing notice will be marked as Exhibit B.

Councilor Gillaspie stated he has concerns regarding their criminal histories and asked the applicants to speak on behalf of those.

Mr. Lucero, Sr. explained that most of the violations on his criminal history were dismissed, except the one that was in San Luis that was a DUI.

Mr. Lucero, Jr. explained that the DWAI that appeared on his criminal history occurred when he was twenty-one years of age and it caused him to go to law school. He is a member of the bar and you have to be of good moral character to be able to be one. He also stated that they have previously held a liquor license in Pueblo, Colorado at their previous restaurant there and does not believe anything has changed in their criminal histories since that time.

Councilor Gillaspie asked about the charge showing an arrest for Ike Lucero, Sr. as recent as 2014. Ike Lucero, Jr. explained the situation regarding that and after talking with the prosecutor about the situation, the case ended up being dismissed.

Councilor Gillaspie stated that they have never seen a liquor license issued to anyone with a criminal history as such of the applicants. Mr. Lucero, Jr. responded by stating that the applicants are long-standing business people in Alamosa and have a good reputation. He also stated that anything found in his criminal record has been dismissed and by law cannot be used against him or his father. Councilor Gillaspie confirmed with the applicants that all the charges that show up on their criminal histories have been dismissed.

Councilor Vigil asked for confirmation of the type of liquor license they are requesting. The applicants are requesting a Hotel/Restaurant license, which is addressed as the title of the license. He also asked what the applicants will be doing with the old location.

The old location will eventually be closed as there is nothing more they can do with

that location and there is also parking issues there. At the new location, they are just planning to upgrade and be able to provide something better for their clientele. They would like to offer two or three different types of liquor and a margarita machine for slush.

Mayor Lucero asked if the applicants hold a liquor license at the current location of their establishment. The applicants stated that they do not and their prior history of having a liquor license was the one they held at the restaurant and bar they operated in Pueblo County for about a year.

The applicants stated that they will remain a small restaurant and that the servers would be the ones to serve the alcohol and they would be trained to card everyone. They only plan to serve beer and margaritas.

Counselor Schwiesow asked if there was anyone in favor wishing to speak.

Dan McCann spoke in support of the small business.

Counselor Schwiesow asked if there was anyone in opposition wishing to speak.

With there being no one further wishing to speak, the public hearing closed at 8:55 p.m.

Councilor Griego asked for clarification of the type of hearing this was. Counselor Schwiesow clarified this hearing was for the applicants to establish that the neighborhood has needs and desires for this license and that they are of good moral character.

Councilor Griego also commented that he has known Mr. Lucero, Sr. for a long time and he has seen him run the business for years and would hate to see it close. He is glad to see that he is continuing his business and moving to a new location where the customers can really enjoy it.

Counselor Schwiesow stated that past practice regarding approval of licenses is that he will prepare findings for Council both for and against and Council will review those and make their decision at the next Council meeting. However, Council can choose to make the decision at that time if they wanted.

Ike Lucero, Jr. stated they would like to open at the new location with everything in place and be able to offer their customers everything at one time and they would be able to wait for the decision from Council on their license.

Council agreed upon waiting for Counsel to provide the findings and make the decision at the next Council meeting.

COUNCIL COMMENT

Councilor Vigil extended his get wells for the two City employees who were injured. He also gave thanks to everyone that helped out with the KaBoom! project.

Councilor Coleman echoed Councilor Vigil's comments.

Councilor Griego and Councilor Stefano also commented in regards to the KaBoom! project.

Mayor Lucero also echoed the previous comments.

There was no need for an executive session.

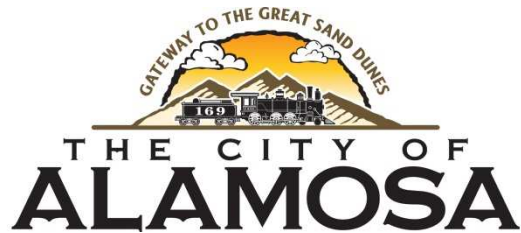

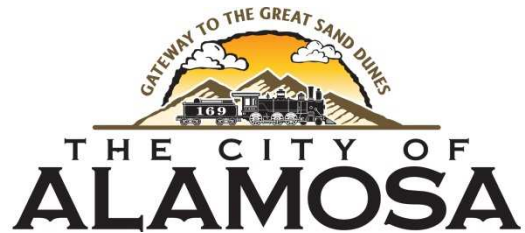

I. CALL TO ORDER AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Regular Meeting of the Alamosa City Council was called to order on the above date by Mayor Josef Lucero at 7:02 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

II. ROLL CALL

Present at roll call: Mayor Josef Lucero, Councilors Greg Gillaspie, Jan Vigil, Charles Griego, Ty Coleman, and Michael Stefano. Also present: City Manager Heather Brooks, City Attorney Erich Schwiesow, and City Clerk Holly Martinez.

III. AGENDA APPROVAL

Councilor Griego moved and seconded by Councilor Vigil to approve the agenda as presented. The motion carried unanimously.

IV. CITIZEN COMMENT

Alamosa City Council welcomes your comments. Citizens wishing to speak may obtain and complete a speaker card through the City Clerk at the start of the meeting.

A. Audience Comments

Elvie Ray Conley introduced himself to City Council. He is a candidate for the Ward Three seat in the 2015 Election.

Christopher Hall and Jermaine Stafford of Rocky Mountain SER spoke in regards to the youth programs that they would like to bring to the City of Alamosa.

Senator Crowther spoke in regards to some of the issues that are going on in the State right now and asked for comments, questions, and concerns from anyone. He also mentioned that Representative Vigil and himself will be at Homelake Cemetery for the dedication of the expansion on September 11 at 1:00 p.m.

VII. REGULAR BUSINESS

A. Presentations from Outside Agencies

1. Alamosa Christmas Light Parade

Dawn Honeycutt gave a recap of the Rodeo and how well it did this year. She also presented information to Council on the next project coming up, which is the Alamosa Christmas Light Parade. This will be held Saturday, December 18, 2015 at 6:30 p.m.

The Christmas Light Parade will cost about \$1,000 - \$1,200. Ms. Honeycutt stated that it would be able to be paid for by Sponsors and the Round-Up funds but wanted to come to Council to see what their recommendation would be and if they would be able to help with some of the funding. She requested if they did, she would request the help of \$500.00.

Council further discussed the request and stated they support the event but there is no money left in their sponsorship fund, however, they will look at the funds during budget discussion and get back to Ms. Honeycutt at a further date regarding the request.

B. Business Brought Forward by City Staff

1. Public Works

- a. Public Hearing and Final Reading, Ordinance No. 9-2015, An Ordinance Amending Section 2-184(e) of Article VI, Chapter 2 of the Code Of Ordinances of the City of Alamosa, Modifying Bidding Procedures

Pat Steenburg reviewed this Ordinance with Council. This ordinance failed to pass when it was first brought to City Council and upon further analysis, the change to this Ordinance now has the preference at a 7 percent preference to bidders located within Alamosa County and a 3 percent preference to bidders outside of Alamosa County but still within the remaining five counties in the San Luis Valley.

Councilor Coleman clarified that this would be helpful to staff when it comes to making the decisions regarding bidding.

Councilor Griego thanked staff for the change and appreciates how it was changed.

Councilor Vigil thanked Pat and staff for listening and changing this Ordinance.

Mayor Lucero also commented regarding this Ordinance and see this as a positive measure.

Mayor Lucero opened the hearing at 7:44 p.m. and asked for those wishing to speak on the matter.

Dan McCann spoke in favor of the Ordinance.

Georgia Cook thanked Council for considering this Ordinance.

There being no one else wishing to speak, the hearing closed at 7:47 p.m.

Councilor Griego moved, second by Councilor Coleman to finally adopt Ordinance No. 9-2015. The motion carried unanimously.

2. Police

- a. Public Hearing, Ordinance No. 12-2015, AN ORDINANCE APPROVING AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT WITH THE ALAMOSA SCHOOL DISTRICT TO PROVIDE A SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER FROM THE ALAMOSA POLICE DEPARTMENT TO THE ALAMOSA SCHOOL DISTRICT

Chief Oakes reviewed this Ordinance with Council. This ordinance is to enter into the intergovernmental agreement with the Alamosa School District to provide a school resource officer from the Alamosa Police Department in the Alamosa schools.

Mayor Lucero opened the hearing at 7:53 p.m. and asked for those wishing to speak on the matter.

Kristina Daniel spoke in support of the way the Alamosa Police Department and the Alamosa District work together for this.

There being no one else wishing to speak, the hearing closed at 7:55 p.m.

Councilor Griego moved, seconded by Councilor Vigil to finally adopt Ordinance No. 12-2015. The motion carried unanimously.

3. City Manager/Legal

- a. Authorize Construction of Office for City Attorney

Heather Brooks presented information to Council. When City Hall was designed and constructed, it was purposefully designed to handle future staffing growth needs. After meeting with the City Attorney, staff feels that it is warranted to construct an office for the performance of his duties and identified a location that can best meet these needs. This will be by dividing the existing break room in half. There is a rough estimate of \$12,000 and will be taken from the non-department budget and most likely come from the general fund balance.

Councilor Vigil moved, seconded by Councilor Gillaspie to authorize staff to add an office for the City Attorney with an estimated cost of \$12,000. The motion carried unanimously.

- b. Public Hearing and Second Reading, Ordinance No. 13-2015 Suspending the 180 Day Limit on Transient Dealers Licenses for Sales and Delivery of Food and/or Beverages for a Period of Three Months to Allow Consideration of an Amendment to the Existing Ordinance Concerning Such Licenses

Heather Brooks reviewed the Ordinance with Council. This ordinance suspends the 180 day limit on transient dealers licenses for sales and delivery of food and/or beverages for a period of three months to allow consideration of an amendment to the existing ordinance concerning such licenses.

Mayor Lucero opened the hearing at 8:08 p.m. and asked for those wishing to speak on the matter.

Background

Attached for your review and information is the Monthly Financial Report for August 2015. The report, which pertains to the City's General fund, has been condensed this month with our new reporting abilities. The report shows the fiscal and period activity within the same report, making it easier to read and understand the City's current position. General fund Expenditures can now be found in the Monthly Expenditure Report.

General Fund Revenue

Total revenue for August was \$578,887.96. The City received payment for 2015 Sales Tax from the county in the amount of \$259,572.82. Sales Tax (*general*) revenue for July totaled \$208,847.47. It is anticipated that sales tax revenues will continue to increase over last year's totals as the economy continues to stabilize as we are currently up 3.57% over 2014 year to day collections.

Retail Sales Tax Licenses

There were no new sales tax licenses and no terminations during the month of August. Staff continues to pursue new opportunities to attract businesses to the area.

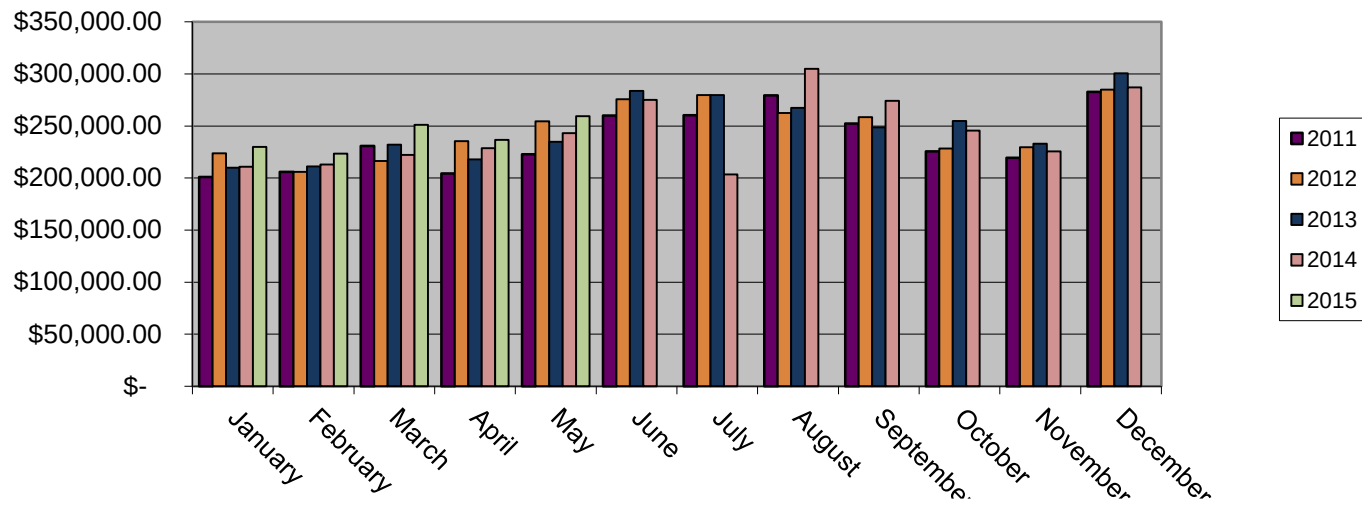
Sales Tax Trends

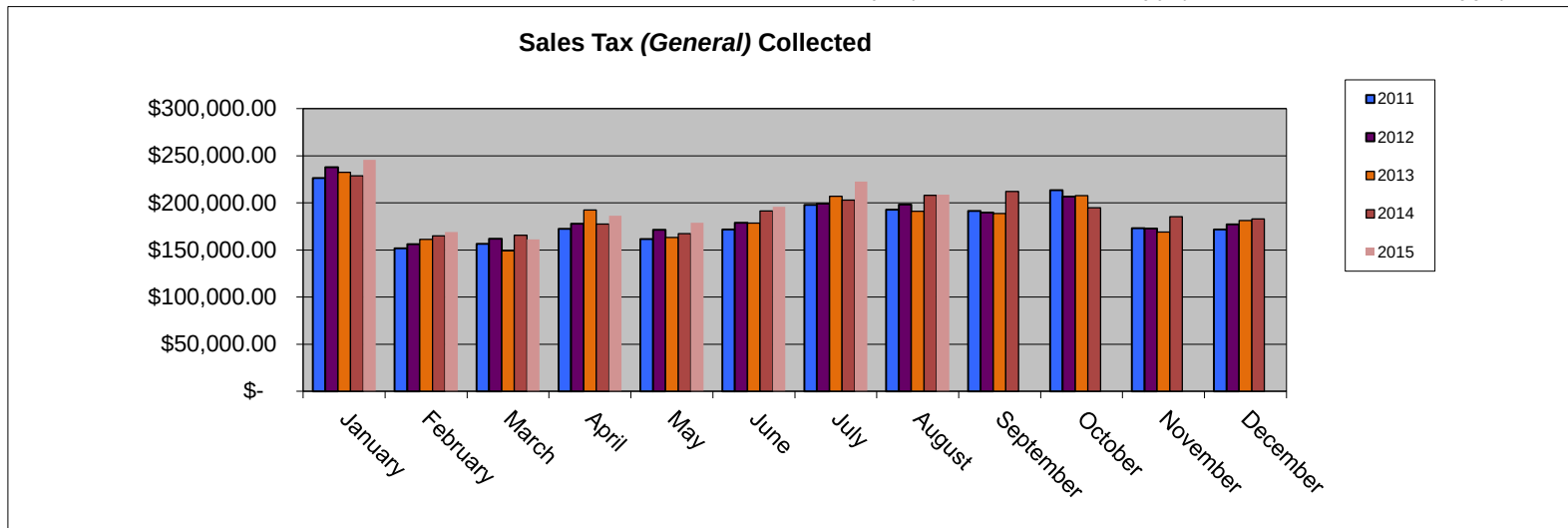

Public Works Department

Streets: The Street Department worked with the seal coat crew. Potholes were patched and the installation of pavement marking on street and parking lots was begun. Assistance was given to the recycling department with brush removal. Open cuts were asphalted. All gravel roads and alleys were bladed. The department prepped Zapata Park for the new playground slab. Street signs city wide were installed were needed.

Solid Waste: Commercial waste hauled totaled 320T., residential 172 T. Thirty one extra pu were completed. Five new yard waste toters were delivered. Seven dumpsters were repaired and four toters.

Recycling: A total of 62 bales of various materials were collected and baled. Sixty eight bales were shipped; totaling 32.26 T. Land fill savings totaled \$551.65.

Building Inspection: Twenty one building permits were issued for a total valuation of \$ 2,164,488.88. Building permit fees collected were \$8,221.89 and construction use tax totaled \$3,313.89. A total of 40 various inspections were conducted. Two certificates of occupancy were issued for single family dwellings. Four general contractor licenses were issued and three limited.

Water: A total of 111,769,000 gallons of water were treated and pumped for municipal use. Water treatment plant production totaled 92,071,000 gallons. The total pumped for the front nine at the golf course was 5,428,335 gallons; back nine 5,257,263 gallons. Turn off/ons for occupant change and repairs totaled 49. Fifteen meters were re-read. Twenty six curb stops were cleaned, five repaired. Installed a 4 ft. bury hydrant at 8th St. and Adams Ave. Moved 4 meter pits out of the new sidewalk on West 8th St. Installed 400 ft. of new 6' water main on La Veta north of First St. and installed new taps as well. The old cast iron line was *taken* out of service. Raised fire hydrant on Sarah Lane twelve inches. Raised the fire hydrant and valve on Briarwood two ft. Replaced VFD drive on the Cole Park well that was damaged by lightening. There were 38 turn offs for non- payment. Twelve valve boxes were raised/ and or lowered.

Wastewater: Total discharge for the month 40.78 million gallons. Set up webinar for Net DMR training. Fabricated metal for diffusers in basins. Valley Lock corrected malfunction on security system. Cleaned and calibrated the effluent probe. The bar screen was repaired. Ordered hose for Aeration basins All monthly testing was performed, safety meetings were attended weekly. Began training additional employee from the Water/Sewer Dept. for weekend/ on call duties.

East Alamosa: A total of 6,610,519 gallons of water were treated and supplied to East Alamosa. Conducted a second walk thru with contractor for lift station project. Checked for broken meter at 7255 Brush Lane. Pulled pumps at Price, Sunnyside, McKinney, McQuerry and Rodeo lift stations and cleaned impellers of debris. Seven sanitary sewers were checked for plugs, two unplugged. Two manholes were cleaned.

Sewer: Nine blocks of sewer line were cleaned. Fourteen manholes were cleaned. The culvert on State Ave at Lava Lane was cleaned. Sixty seven sanitary sewers were inspected; twenty two checked at customer's request, fifteen were unplugged. Six new sewer services were installed, three manholes were raised. Dug up and corrected grade on sewer line at 1502 West 8th St. Installed a new control panel and pumps at 20th St. lift station. Dug up and repaired sewer main at 406 13th St. to stop sinkhole. Pumps were pulled at Wal Mart lift station to remove debris from impellers. All storm lift stations were checked.

August 2015 Report

- Upgraded the VMWare server software on all City host servers to version 5.5 u2e. This update ensured that each of our three primary host servers are running the exact same version of VMWare. This upgrade was needed in order to merge the police MVR project into the City host configuration. With this latest update we are now able to fully support Windows 2012 R2 Servers in a virtual environment.

- Worked with Viaero to reinitialize all City owned Hotspot technology. This included all of the Police Department.

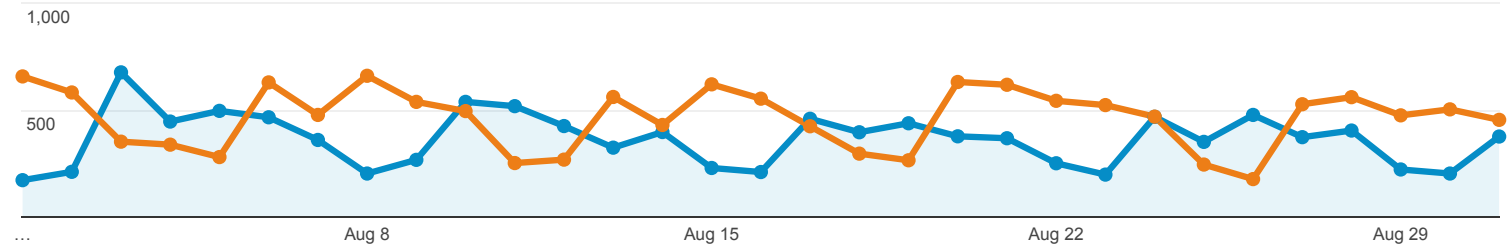

Alamosa has been awarded a grant from KaBOOM! to build a new playground because of the generous funding of Colorado Health Foundation. KaBOOM! is a national non-profit dedicated to bringing balanced and active play into the daily lives of all kids. They create great places to play, inspire communities to promote and support play, and work to drive the national discussion about the importance of play in fostering healthy lives and communities. Colorado Health Foundation is a nonprofit organization that strives to make Colorado the healthiest state in the nation, by focusing on three community outcome areas: Healthy Living, Health Coverage and Health Care.

ADDED BONUS: also include a 5 station outdoor fitness exercise system for ages 13 and up. Features 120 exercises designed to work nearly all of the 206 bones and 600 muscles in the human body ([flyer](#)).

This grant was made possible by the partnership of several groups including La Puente, the South-Side Revitalization Group, the City of Alamosa, and the Alamosa Rotary Club. The project included a Community Design Day on July 30 where both kids and adults participated in designing the park space for Zapata Park (885 Ross Avenue). Not only is this a wonderful opportunity to transform a local park, but since the process is based entirely on community input and vision, it is a chance for Alamosa residents, young and old, to come together and dream big and make it a reality.

Design Voting Results:

Design C was the winner with 323 of the 554 votes cast

- Greatest opportunities for slide and balance as part of our “ninja warrior” themed playground.
- Largest main structure space cleverly divided for older and younger kids.
- Three slides as well as imaginative pieces such as the telescope, babble-on and animal locator panel.

- Unique pieces such as the geovertical climber, rope link and crater ladder for climbing up and well as pieces like the sky link for climbing across.
- Challenges pieces are connected by buttons and logs to make the whole space feel like an obstacle course.
- Includes a cozy cocoon in the corner for when you need a break from all that climbing and balancing.

Subject/Title:

Award of Bid – Glass Pulverizer

Recommended Action:

That Council award the Glass Pulverizer bid to Andela Products for a total price of \$43,950.

Background:

A Request for Proposals was advertised for the 2015 Rickey Recycling Center Glass Pulverizer with two firms responding. The bid resulted in the following prices:

<u>Company</u>	<u>Model</u>	<u>Total Cost</u>
Glass Aggregate Systems	H-100VT	\$42,865.00
Andela Products	GP-Mega Mini	\$43,950.00

Andela Products is the manufacturer of the equipment used at all three of the glass pulverizing facilities I have personally visited and the operators have all expressed appreciation for the simplicity of the operation and maintenance of the pulverizing unit. I have not seen a Glass Aggregate Systems unit in operation but have spoken with an operator in Angel Fire, New Mexico. He was generally happy with the equipment, he did, however, express some issue with the small size of the conveyor and what seemed to him to be excessive wear in the sanding unit of the equipment. The Andela unit creates the edge-free glass with a series of high speed flail hammers that does not require a separate sanding unit. This consideration, as well as the numbers of units in operation, and a three to four week faster delivery time compels me to recommend the Andela unit over the Glass Aggregate Systems bid.

Issue Before the Council:

Does Council wish to award the 2015 Rickey Recycling Center Glass Pulverizer bid to Andela Products in the amount of \$43,950?

Alternatives:

Council may award the bid to Andela Products in the amount of \$43,950 as per staff recommendation, Council may award the bid to Glass Aggregate Systems in the amount of \$42,865, or Council may reject all bids with or without providing staff further guidance.

Fiscal Impact:

\$50,000 was originally budgeted for this purchase, no additional funds will be required.

Currently, our cost to dispose of 1 ton of glass at the landfill is estimated at roughly \$25.50. For the glass actually captured from the wastestream and processed in the pulverizer, that cost of disposal will be an estimated \$11.30 per ton, allowing for substantial savings in the cost of disposal. However, it should be noted that not all glass will be captured from the wastestream. In addition, the cost of disposal in the pulverizer will apply to all glass brought to the Rickey Recycling Center, whether that glass would otherwise have been in the City's wastestream or whether that glass is from a source completely outside the City, for which the City would otherwise have not incurred any disposal costs. Until we have operational experience with the pulverizer it is not possible to estimate these offsetting considerations.

Legal Opinion:

City Attorney will be present for comment.

Conclusion:

As you know, the opportunity for local glass disposal at our recycling center has been long requested and well received by residents. Our plan to re-use the material locally rather than ship the produced cullet to an out of valley recycling facility has removed those costs from the equation and should allow us to provide a sustainable service for the citizens of Alamosa.

ORDINANCE NO. 14-2015

AN ORDINANCE RENAMING COTTONWOOD DRIVE AND COTTONWOOD COURT AS DEPICTED ON THE REPLAT OF CARROLL SUBDIVISION – ADDITION NO. 2, AS FILED IN THE RECORDS OF THE ALAMOSA COUNTY CLERK AND RECORDER ON NOVEMBER 16, 1982 UNDER RECEPTION NO. 220402

WHEREAS, streets within a recently developed portion of the Carroll Subdivision are named Cottonwood Drive and Cottonwood Court; and

WHEREAS, similar street names in different parts of the City and County could potentially create confusion for emergency responders; and

WHEREAS, Cottonwood Drive is an extension of Douglas Drive and Cottonwood Court is a short cul-de-sac extending easterly from Cottonwood Drive; and

WHEREAS, The Planning Commission has unanimously recommended that Cottonwood Drive be renamed Douglas Drive and Cottonwood Court be renamed Douglas Court.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Alamosa, Colorado:

Section 1. That Cottonwood Drive be renamed Douglas Drive and Cottonwood Court be renamed Douglas Court.

Section 2. General Repealer. All acts, orders, ordinances, resolutions, or portions thereof in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 3. Recording and Authentication. This ordinance, immediately upon its passage, shall be authenticated by the signatures of the Mayor and City Clerk, recorded in the City Book of Ordinances kept for that purposes, and published according to law.

Section 4. Publication and Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect ten (10) days after publication following final passage. Publication both before and after final passage shall be by the title of this ordinance, which Council determines constitutes a sufficient summary of the ordinance, together with the statement that the full text of the ordinance is available for public inspection and acquisition on the City's website and in the office of the City Clerk.

Section 5. Declaration of Public Interest. This ordinance is necessary to preserve the peace, health, safety, welfare, and to serve the best interest of the citizens of the City of Alamosa, Colorado.

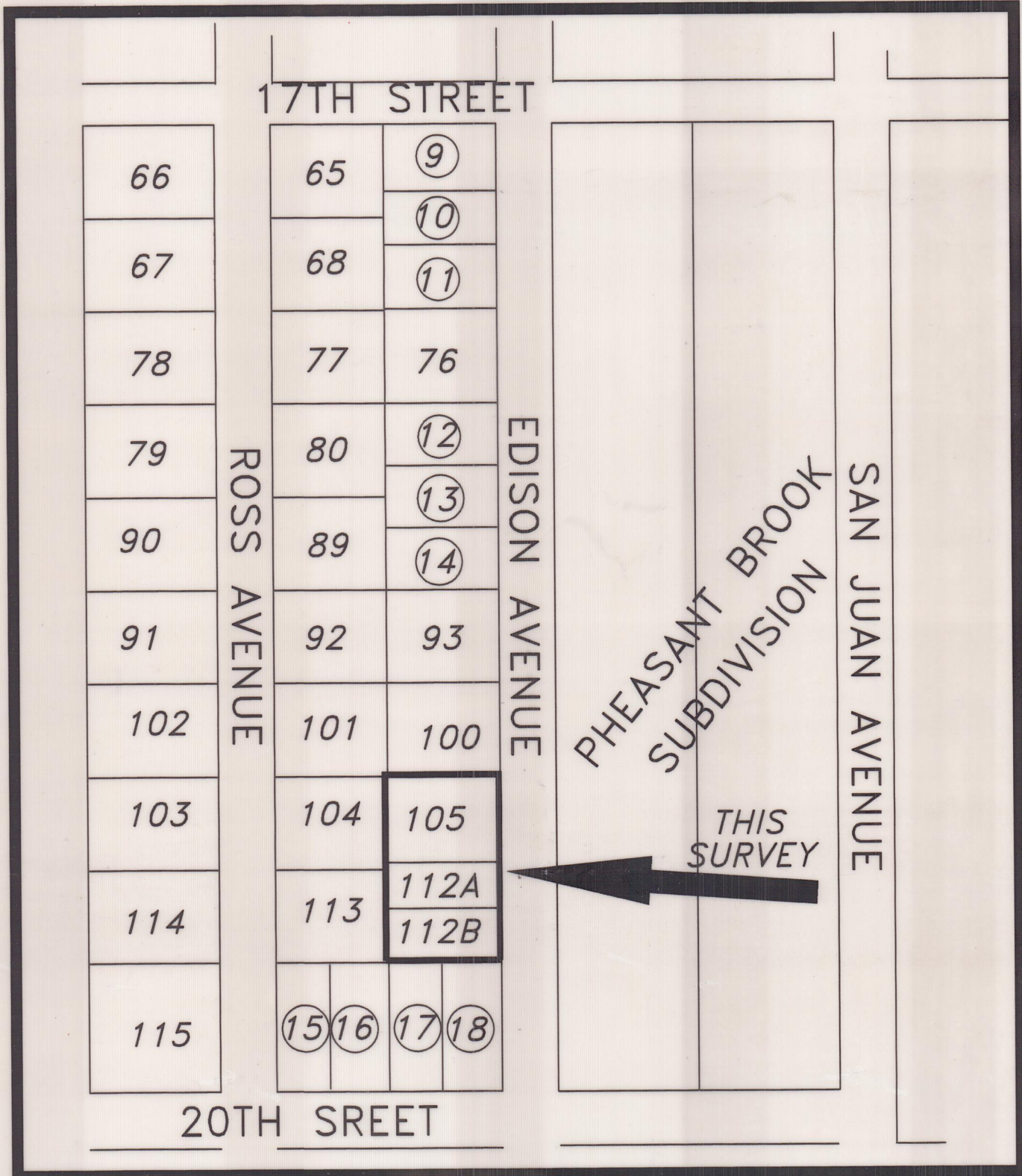

Colorado Regulation 47-310(E)

E. When a licensing authority is required to make a determination as to the character, record and reputation of existing licensees or applicants for new licenses, including transfers of ownership of existing licenses, the authority may consider the following factors, which may include but not be limited to the following:

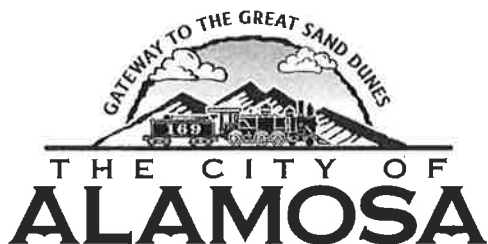
1. Subject to 24-5-101, C.R.S., the applicant or licensee has submitted false applications, made willful misrepresentations and/or committed fraudulent acts;
2. The application or licensee has a criminal history of crimes of moral turpitude. By way of example, crimes of moral turpitude shall include but not be limited to, murder, burglary, robbery, arson, kidnapping, sexual assault, illegal drugs or narcotics convictions;
3. The applicant or licensee has had previous alcohol beverage licenses denied or revoked as a result of violations of law, resulting in finding of bad moral character by any licensing authority;
4. The applicant or licensee has been found to be currently delinquent in the payment of any state or local taxes, and record of such tax delinquency has been filed in a court having jurisdiction, or has been made a public record by some other lawful means;
5. The applicant or licensee has established pattern of multiple statutory violations which resulted in the revocation or denial of any other professional license, leading to the finding of bad moral character by any licensing authority.

F. Pursuant to 24-5-101, C.R.S., when making a determination as to the character, record or reputation of a licensee or applicant as required by Title 12, Article 46, 47 and 48, the licensing authority shall also consider evidence of rehabilitation. Such evidence may include, but not be limited to, evidence of no criminal history record information, educational achievements, financial solvency, community standing, lack of additional arrests or convictions, or the lack of parole or probation violations since the date of last conviction.

CRS 24-5-101 states:

(2) Whenever any state or local agency is required to make a finding that an applicant for a license, certification, permit, or registration is a person of good moral character as a condition to the issuance thereof, the fact that such applicant has, at some time prior thereto, been convicted of a felony or other offense involving moral turpitude, and pertinent circumstances connected with such conviction, shall be given consideration in determining whether, in fact, the applicant is a person of good moral character at the time of the application. The intent of this section is to expand employment opportunities for persons who, notwithstanding that fact of conviction of an offense, have been rehabilitated and are ready to accept the responsibilities of a law-abiding and productive member of society.

As the Local Licensing Authority, Council is charged with affording the applicant due process during the hearing, then making a determination whether or not the applicant is of good moral character at the time of the application.

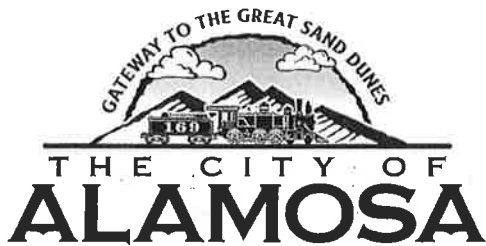

You are hereby advised that an investigation has been made with regard to the application made by Ike & Ike Inc., d/b/a El Charro Cafe, for a Hotel/Restaurant License at 1605 Main Street in Alamosa, Colorado. Based on the results thereof, the following has been determined:

1. The location of the premises for which the license is sought is 1605 Main Street in Alamosa, Colorado. This location is within the Alamosa City Limits and falls under the jurisdiction of the Alamosa City Council sitting as the Local Licensing Authority.
2. In the two years proceeding the date of application acceptance, there has not been a denial of a Hotel/Restaurant License application for the reason that the reasonable requirements of the neighborhood were satisfied by the existing outlets.
3. It appears from the application documents that you are entitled to possession of the premises where you propose to exercise the license applied for, and that the possession will continue throughout the initial term of the license, if granted.
4. The sale of liquor on the proposed premises is not a violation of City of Alamosa zoning, building, and fire laws or regulations.
5. The proposed location is within 500 feet from a school, but is allowed through Ordinance No. 7, 2011.
6. The Alamosa City Council has designated the Neighborhood to be the city limits plus a one-mile radius. You, as the applicant, may accept that designation or present alternative evidence.



7. A criminal background check of records from the CBI has turned up criminal records on both shareholders. A copy of those records is enclosed. Council may consider whether those records indicate a concern with the good moral character of the shareholders of the Applicant, pursuant to C.R.S. § 12-47-307(1)(a)(III) and (3)(a). If Council does consider these criminal records, it will also consider any information provided by you concerning these records, including, but not limited to, character references, educational achievements, and evidence of rehabilitation, especially during the time between the last conviction and the filing of the application. C.R.S. § 12-47-307(3)(a).

The public hearing on your application has been set for Wednesday, September 16, 2015 beginning at 7:00 p.m. or shortly thereafter. The hearing will take place in Alamosa Council Chambers, 300 Hunt Avenue in Alamosa. At said hearing, you shall have an opportunity to be heard regarding all matters of consideration of your application. Be advised that you, as the applicant, are burdened with persuading City Council, who is the Local Liquor Licensing Authority, that the granting of this license will meet the needs of the neighborhood and the desires of the adult inhabitants of the neighborhood. If you fail to present convincing evidence, the application will be denied.

In addition to being satisfied with the evidence adduced at the hearing that the granting of the application will meet the needs of the neighborhood and satisfy the desires of the inhabitants of the neighborhood for the proposed liquor establishment, City Council may inquire as the suitability of the character of both stockholders, with respect to the criminal history results from CBI.

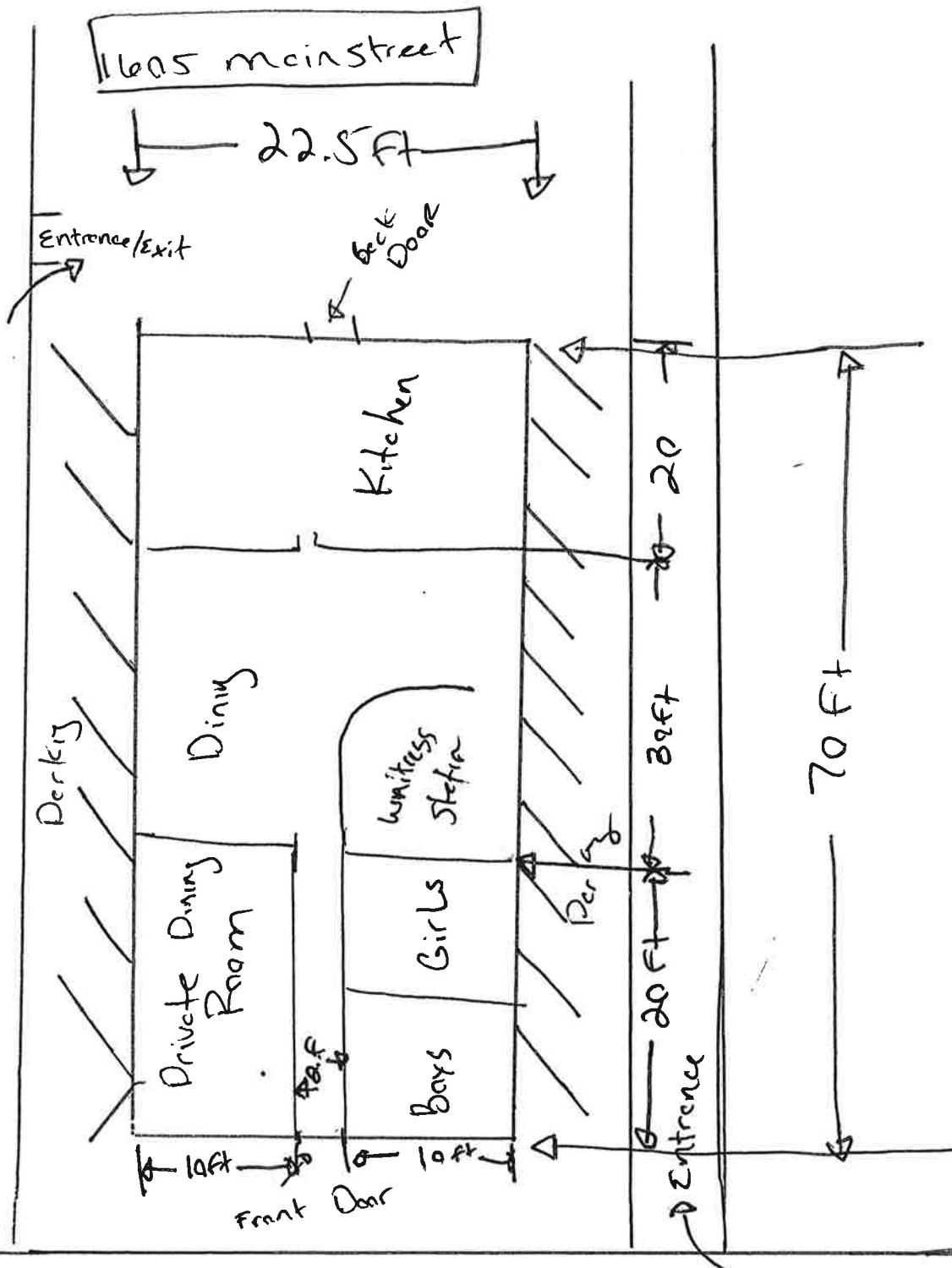
